#### Map to Guy's Party Center 500 East Waterloo Road Akron, Ohio 44319

\*After following most of these directions, Guy's is a very short distance from the exit on the left, just before Giant Eagle and across the street from Scorchers and the Waterloo Restaurant.

#### From the North (Akron, Cuy. Falls, Hudson, E. Cleve) Take Route 8 south until it becomes 77 south. Continue on 77 south for a little less than 2 more miles. Take the Waterloo Rd exit. Turn right at the bottom of the ramp. From the Northwest (Fairlawn, Montrose, W. Cleve) Follow 77 south until it combines with 76 and then separates again, heading south (Rt 8 will head north, 77 will head south, take 77 south). Continue for a little less

than 2 more miles. Take the Waterloo Rd exit. Turn right at the bottom of the ramp.

#### From the East (Kent, Ravenna, Youngstown)

Follow 76 west to 77 south. Continue on 77 south for a little less than 2 miles. Take the Waterloo Road exit. Turn right at the bottom of the exit ramp.

**From the West (I-71, Wadsworth, Barberton)** Take 76/224 east until it turns into only St. Rt. 224. Follow St. Rt. 224 east to the Main Street exit. Turn left onto Main at the end of the exit ramp. Turn right at first major intersection -- Waterloo. Guy's is about a mile up on the right, just past Giant Eagle and across the street from Scorchers and the Waterloo Restaurant.

#### From the South (Canton)

This is a little strange, but the easiest way. There is an exit ramp onto Waterloo from 77 south, but NOT from 77 north, so follow 77 north to the Wilbeth Road exit. Get off on that exit, then make two lefts, thus getting back onto 77 going SOUTH. Take the very next exit - Waterloo Rd. Turn right at the bottom of the exit ramp.

**From the Southeast (Canfield, Boardman, Alliance)** Follow St. Rt. 224 west to Kelley Ave/Waterloo Rd exit. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp and then, almost immediately, left onto Waterloo Rd. Take Waterloo Rd past where it crosses under I-77.







## **Councilor's Corner**

#### Councilor Summary, January 2007

Hello from your Akron SPE councilor! I just returned from the winter 2007 meeting held in Charleston, South Carolina.



The main business accomplished was election of the national officers for the upcoming year.

President-elect will be William J.J. O'Connell. Paul Anderson won for Senior Vice President. James Griffing won for Vice President, Divisions. Our friend from Pittsburgh, Dick Cameron, won for Chair for the C.O.W. committee.

#### **Sections Meeting**

The highlights of the section meeting were mainly around discussions on regionalization. Three "new" sections were formed from mergers of other sections.

Jamal El-Hebri gave an excellent summary as the host section, Southern Section which includes Southern Georgia and South Carolina. This section has over 500 members and two student chapters, publishes 8 newsletters per year (4 electronic and 4 paper), website is spesouthern.org. They have a variety of technical meetings and are most successful with Topcons and tours, sponsor an essay contest and give presentations on plastics to the local secondary schools. They came across as a good section with an enthusiastic board.

Elliott Weinberg gave a short presentation on regionalization. This is the term adopted for several "regional" sections joining together to form one larger and stronger section. His main message is that is inevitable and already happening with several sections.

There was a discussion of technical meetings. What is working well is events rather than monthly meeting. Also, company support for SPE membership and activities is not as strong as in the past. Membership nationally is essentially flat and AIM is working well as a recruitment tool.

Barbar Arnold-Feret conducted a poll on 15 potential activities for council and sections over topics such as changing the current proxy system, regionalization, rebate changes, etc. The top 3-4 will be presented later after the council meeting is done.

#### **COW Meeting**

Rebate requirements were discussed. They are the section must have officers, financial report and the councilor must attend at least 2 of the 4 meetings. Mergers were also discussed and Tricia McKnight highlighted what is needed for sections to do a merger.

Ernie Coleman discussed highlights of the Publications Committee. There is a new format to the Plastics Engineering magazine. There will be less ads with more technical articles. Mini-tech guidelines were also discussed and there is a need for a more thorough communication from the conference committee on this subject. Also, more communication about these events is needed on a national level.

#### MAIN COUNCIL MEETING

Officers for the upcoming year were elected, see above details.

Tim Womer gave an initial discussion and highlighted his year -- one of his main messages was that the "strong" sections need to help the weaker sections with Mini-techs, communications, etc.

During the main council meeting there were several interesting presentations.

The treasurer reported that SPE finished the year in the black but short of budget. The shortfall was mainly due to a lower than anticipated ANTEC attendance and the advertising revenues from Plastics Engineering were also lower than expected.

Vickie Flaris, current President-elect and soon to be President, gave the operating plan for the upcoming year. Her three main objectives will be to grow SPE globally, grow communications and increase value of SPE to its members.

Reports were given from the following committees: Divisions, Sections, International, ANTEC and Conferences. There were several minor revisions to the bylaws that were approved by council. Susan Olderwald gave Executive and Staff report and summary. Awards were presented to several council members for international activities and other recognition.

I found my first meeting other than ANTEC most interesting and educational. Next meeting is ANTEC, and I thank Vivian Malpass for being my proxy at the September meeting in Pittsburgh. Let me know if you want input at the next meeting. Thank you.

2007 Scholarship Program Information

## Background

The purpose of the Akron Section SPE Scholarship Program is to promote knowledge in polymer science, engineering, and technology. Started in 1990, it has awarded over \$211,000 to area students. Particular emphasis is given to students enrolling in two- and four-year programs with a plastics application.

Scholarships for up to \$3,000 per year will be granted for tuition, books, laboratory fees, and other educational costs for courses necessary to earn a certificate or associate or baccalaureate degree in preparation for a career in polymers.

## **General Information**

The Scholarship Selection Committee consists of three to five Akron Section SPE members appointed by the President of the Akron Section.

## Committee tasks include:

- 1. Judging candidates based on established criteria and selecting scholarship recipients for Board approval.
- 2. Monitoring recipients' performances.
- 3. Determining eligibility for scholarship renewals.

# The criteria for candidate selection are:

- 1. Scholastic Achievement
  - a. Grade point average.

- b. Courses and exposure to polymer related subjects).
- 2. Interest in a plastics career
  - a. Submitting an essay outlining career interests and goals.
- 3. Financial need
- 4. Social qualities
  - a. Leadership.
  - b. Extracurricular activities.
- 5. Two letters of reference from instructors or supervisors. (to be included with application)
- 6. Residence within area covered by Akron SPE.

## First-time Applicants

Interested students from local high schools, technical, and vocational schools, and area colleges are encouraged to fill out the attached SPE Scholarship Application form, including the essay, references, and current transcript.

All scholarships are awarded for one year with option for renewal. The awards are for full-time students only. Co-op students are also eligible.

## **Renewal Applicants**

# The scholarship recipient must:

- 1. Maintain a minimum **2.5/4.0** grade point average or equivalent.
- 2. Submit grade reports and course selections demonstrating polymer-related curriculum **prior to start of next semester.**
- Apply for renewal scholarship using SPE application form. (References and essay are not required for renewal.)

Names of scholarship recipients will be distributed to donor companies for possible internship or cooperative programs.

The number of scholarships awarded per year will be variable depending on the number of qualifying applicants.
