


### Map to Martin University Center 105 Fir Hill Street Akron, Ohio



Some program subjects being considered are medical plastic applications, e.g. implants, fuel cells, applications of nanofibers, biopolymers, alternate energy sources, water purification e.g. via desalination, photovoltaics, flexible displays, and the general process of technology transfer from lab to marketplace.

#### Councilor's Corner

Hello fellow SPE members.

As the council representative for the Akron Section I have included below some highlights of the first Virtual Council Meeting held on February 19, 2010. Yes, council members are now participating in the Societies council meetings via a remote link utilizing the latest in computer and internet technology. All electronic participants (with the exception of guests) were officially allowed to be seated, vote and fully participate in the meeting. I was one of Fifty-nine Councilors/Proxies and fourteen guests who participated electronically.

SPE ended December with 14,500 members. The membership total for month end January was 14,750. The goal is to halt membership declines, grow membership to 16,000, and kick-start a new member-growth cycle. The Council continues to address the decline in membership and focus on growth of our society.

Financial issues were discussed and there will be an annual audit the week of Feb 22nd. As you may know SPE has sold its building and moved its headquarters to save money. When the building sale and associated costs are included, as well as other capital gains/losses, SPE made roughly \$1.395 million last year.

Council approved holding the 2013 Annual Business Meeting in Cincinnati. As ANTEC is held in conjunction with the Annual Business Meeting, Cincinnati will be the site of ANTEC 2013. The next formal Council meeting is scheduled for May 16, 2010, in Orlando, Florida USA.






