

'ASTIANT'S MESSA Our Akron Section Awards Night on Monday, May 19 was a resounding success. The attendance of 55 students, parents, teachers, members and guests was very encouraging. Bob Wegelin did an excellent job in selecting the Raintree CC as the venue. Our guest speakers were Tim Womer from SPE International and Tom Waltermire from Team NEO. Tim gave us an update on International SPE and its educational activities with comments on the successful recent SPE ANTEC in Milwaukee and the first combined NPE Show and SPE ANTEC Technical program set for Chicago in June 2009. Tom Waltermire, the CEO of Team NEO and past Chairman and CEO of PolyOne Corporation, described the mission and activities of Team NEO. This is a joint venture of the chambers of commerce of the major cities in the NEO region and the Fund for our Economic Future. Team NEO serves as a catalyst for enhancing business in NEO with an emphasis on high growth clusters and combines resources with government economic development organizations to market the assets of the region to attract new business development. Team NEO also assists nonprofit economic development organizations in NEO to improve their effectiveness. Tom presented data showing a surprising overall growth rate of 6% for NEO industry over the last ten years. The fastest growing market segment is the plastics and polymer manufacturing which is very good news for students deciding to enter our industry. He also gave some examples of specific developments which will be driving this growth in the future such as flexible liquid crystal films and nano-technology.

Hemant Thakkar, our Awards and Education Chairman, then presented the scholarship awards. These included eight Special Merit Scholarship Awards, five named scholarship awards, and awards to Science Fair and Essay Contest winners. The recently elected new Fellows of the Society—Dr. Sadhan Jana and Dr. Avram Isayev—and new Honored Member of the Society—Dr. Lloyd Goettler—were recognized by the Section for their achievements. Also, Joe Mattingly was recognized for the section winning the Gold Pinnacle Award, and Kaan Gunes and Todd Lewis were recognized for winning the SPE Outstanding Student Chapter and SPE Chase Student Chapter Awards. Finally, Dr. Dan Jones of Lockheed Martin was inducted into the Section's Plastics Hall of Honor. Photographs of all the 43 Hall of Honor recipients will be on display in the foyer of the Polymer Engineering Department of Akron University

We are moving ahead with our program planning for 2008-9 which will be focused on the 50th Anniversary of the Akron Section. Our six monthly technical meetings will feature different local companies from different segments of the plastics industry including compounders, processors, mold makers, additive suppliers and finished product suppliers, and wind up with a Gala Night in April 2009. We welcome all input on our monthly meeting program and ideas for future programs, as well as any suggestions for improving the value of SPE to our membership.



Councilor's Corner

Antec, Milwaukee May 3,4 2008

Akron section

1. Joined and attended the conference committee. Conference attendance is doing well in spite of the economy. An agreement was reached on a one page form for use by sections/divisions having minitecs. It is not a guideline but just a form to get the details into national so they can post the information.

2. Sections meeting. A relatively quiet meeting.

- I reported on the database for technical meetings. There is a subcommittee and next step is to get a beta version out to selected divisions and sections for trials. We had lots of volunteers from the audience to try the beta version. The timing is that it would be launched from the national web site after the web site redesign. Timing is most likely early 4th quarter.

- It also appears that some sections are still trying to go electronic with their newsletter and one member volunteered to repost a guide to help sections do this. Paper newsletters have gotten too expensive. A straw poll showed about 80% of sections are using electronic newsletters. The councilor from Texas highlighted their new meeting focus which will be on companies who use plastics. The other strong trend is towards minitees hosted by 2-3 sections.

3. Both council meetings were relatively quiet as well. Highlights follow

- Budget is on track for year. Biggest loss of revenue is the Plastics Engineering magazine and biggest revenue is Antec.

- Antec was doing well and should come in or exceed budget.

- Bill McConnell took over from Vicki Flaris. He gave his new operating plan and introduced his theme "Make It Happen".

- Membership continues to shrink slightly on a national level.

- NPE/Antec for 2009 should be a great event. Paper submittals will be due earlier to allow for more marketing of the technical sessions. This event should present a unique opportunity to get new members.

- Web redesign is slightly behind but should initiate in June-July of 2008.

- No big votes except on some minor bylaw changes.
- Next meeting is in October in Connecticut.

4. Milwaukee section had a nice dinner and meeting on the Saturday before Antec. The Milwaukee section is larger than Akron but seems to have some of the same issues. Technical meeting attendance is down and they are searching for ways to entice more members. One recommendation is to have good meetings and not concentrate on the amount of people that actually attend.

5. Idea for celebration, have a mystery dinner. We could even host it at Stan Hywet.
