

Since the inception in 1988, the Akron Society of Plastics Engineers Educational Foundation has grown to its current position through the hard work of many volunteers and the generosity of the local business community. Over the twelve years that the foundation has been in existence, it has provided scholarships to over 210 young men and women totaling in excess of \$275,000 to assist them in furthering their careers in the polymer industry.
