


Map to Demag Plastics Group







- AIM, 76 of 211 have joined! Conversion rate of 36% is excellent.







- 1. You can't know everything, but you can know someone who has the answer.
 - This comes from contacts made at SPE Meetings, conferences and seminars etc.
- 2. Keep up with what's happening engineering wise: latest technology, who is doing what and how.
 - -In today's fast moving world, the internet, while a great resource, does not replace a face-to-face contact. You had better keep up or else!
- 3. New ideas and inspiration from talking with others.
 - -As a plastics professional, whether you are in production, tooling, design, machinery, or resin, you can dry up, and need inspiration from time to time.

All the foregoing requires effort, time and energy, but it pays off in our competitive environment.
